From the Attendance Office

We would like to inform you about the recent update to our tardy policy at Cactus Shadows High School, which aligns with the state's revised guidelines. Going forward, we will differentiate between absences and tardies.

As outlined in Board Policy JH-R:

"Tardies are considered a disruption to the classroom environment. Arriving late not only limits the learning time for tardy students but also disrupts the education of others. Students are expected to be on campus in time for the commencement of the school day. Any student arriving late for the first scheduled class should proceed directly to the office for a pass to be admitted to class. Students consistently arriving late to school may be subject to disciplinary action."

Disciplinary actions for tardies will be implemented as follows:

• (5) Tardies: Warning

• (9) Tardies: Lunch detention for one day

• (13) Tardies: Saturday school

We appreciate your cooperation in ensuring a punctual and focused learning environment for all students. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this policy, please feel free to reach out to the attendance office at 480-575-2433.

Some attendance reminders:

- If you are picking up your student, you must come into the office with a valid picture ID. Students can not be waiting for you. Students will be called out upon your arrival.
- For our driving students parents must call PRIOR to the student leaving. (Even if they are 18 years old.) Once called out, the student must sign out in the front office. Leaving campus without these two things happening will result in disciplinary action.

Course Registration for 2024-25 School Year: Course registration for the 2024-2025 school year will be starting at the end of January. The timeline and process may look different than in past years, we will be doing it by grade levels starting with our class of 2025 (current Juniors), then moving to our class of 2026 (current Sophomores), then to our class of 2027 (current Freshman), then finally to our class of 2028 (current 8th grade students). We will have a parent coffee with the counselors for each grade level before students begin registering for courses. Please look over your student's course registration card and review their choices with them. It's important for students to select alternates for their elective courses in case their first choice is not available. If they do not select an alternate and their first choice class is full, we will place them in a course that has availability. FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid) The 2024–25 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form is available periodically as part of a soft launch. During the soft launch, the FAFSA form will be available for short periods of time while we monitor site performance and form functionality. We will initiate pauses for site maintenance and to make technical updates as needed to provide you with a better experience. Even if you believe you will not qualify for financial aid it is very important for all seniors and their families to fill this out. Why? The FAFSA will be used by post secondary institutions to help award scholarships as well as any aid which is not already given by the Federal Government or in terms of loans. There were some challenges with the website the first few days and it appears it is now fixed.
